Hence, it will be a time taking exercise. Therefore, in order to avoid interest burden on Implementing Agency, it was decided with the consensus of representatives of the Implementing Agency that the agency may repay the principal outstanding loan amount along with the due interest to NCRPB in lump sum.	In accordance with the decision taken in the 55th PSMG-I Meeting, HSIIDC has refunded the outstanding NCRPB loan amount along with the due interest total amounting to Rs.33.07 crore (Principal Rs.31.13 cr. + interest Rs.1.94 cr.) to NCRPB in lump sum on 20.1.2018.

Agenda Item No. 3: Status Note on Assistance by Asian Development Bank (ADB) and KfW (German Development Bank) to NCRPB.

Asian Development Bank

ADB has approved a loan of US \$ 150 million to NCRPB as a Multi-Tranche Financing Facility for financing infrastructure projects in the National Capital Region (NCR) and its Counter Magnet Areas (CMAs). The loan agreement for the 1st tranche of US \$ 78 million was signed between ADB and NCRPB on 17.3.2011. Out of Tranche-1 loan amount of USD 78 million, USD 18.01 million has been cancelled. Board has already utilized the entire loan amount of USD 59.99 million (INR 352.06 crore) by the loan closing date of 31.12.2014 for tranche1. The repayment period is 25 years with 5 years moratorium for repayment of the principal amount. The loan was disbursed to participating States subject to compliance with ADB procurement guidelines and environmental and social safeguards requirements.

B. Reimbursement of Commitment Charges:

Two MMTC projects at Anand Vihar and Sarai Kale Khan have been dropped.

<u>Commitment Charges pertaining to Govt. of Delhi:</u> A reminder Letter dated 24.05.2018 was issued by the Member Secretary, NCRPB to the Chief Secretary, Govt. of NCT of Delhi requesting for reimbursement of commitment charges to the tune of Rs.69,95,613.81 up to 31.01.2013 being borne & paid by NCRPB to ADB on account of the two non-starter projects of the Transport Department, Govt. of NCT of Delhi. The Latest D.O letter also highlighted the details of the earlier several letters issued by NCRPB to the Govt. of Delhi in this regard.

In the 35th Board Meeting of the NCR planning Board held on 09.06.2015, it has been decided that the amount which has been paid by the Board to ADB towards commitment charges may be recovered from GNCTD, Delhi

Inspite of repeated reminders & discussions in steering committee meeting held under the chairmanship of Chief Secretary, GNCT Delhi on 28.09.2017 and Subsequently, despite assurance by the representative of the GNCT of Delhi in the 55th meeting of the Project Sanctioning & Monitoring Group-I (PSMG-I) held on 14.11.2017 that '*commitment charges shall be paid in a months' time'*, the same has still not been re-paid by the Govt. of NCT Delhi.

Matter is placed before the Group for information and impress the GNCT Delhi on expediting payment of Commitment Charges.

C. Debt Service:

Board has been making regular payments of its dues to ADB. So far, Board has made payment of Rs.15.58 cr. (\$ 2.45 million) to ADB on account of interest and commitment charges. Further, Board has repaid an amount of Rs.18.09 cr. (\$ 2.74 mn) towards principal outstanding to ADB.

KfW - (German Development Bank)

Loan agreements of Euro 100 million + Euro 1 million Grant for environment friendly schemes in the water supply, sewerage, drainage, solid waste management and urban transport Sectors to National Capital Region Planning Board were signed between NCRPB & KfW on 09.02.2012 & 30.03.2012. The repayment period will be 15 years with 5 years moratorium for repayment of the principal amount. The loan is at a fixed rate of Interest @ 1.83% p.a. A total amount of Rs.567.31 Crores (Euro: 77.47 million) has been claimed & disbursed by KfW to the Board.

* Board had added the project "Noida Metro Rail Corporation (NMRC)" in the list of projects being under implementation through KfW Line of Credit in order to cover the initial funding Gap of Euro: 20.27 million available under the KfW Ioan. NCRPB has released a Ioan amount of Rs. 1130 crore till financial year 2017-18 to Noida Metro Rail Corporation (NMRC). KfW has reimbursed an amount of INR: 143.74 crore (Euro:20.18 million) on the said project.

* However, due to some of the projects which are being under implementation through KfW line of credit are expected to get completed at cost much lesser than what was originally projected and exchange rate variation, a funding Gap has emerged. Considering the same KfW has increased/reallocated the funding limit for the project NMRC to the ceiling of Euro: 30.68 mn instead of Euro:20.27 mn.

Matter is placed before the Group for information.

B. Debt Service:

Board has also been making regular payments of its dues to KfW. Board has made payment of Rs.23.92 cr. (\in 3.16 million) to KfW on account of interest and commitment charges up to 30.12.2017. Further, Board has repaid an amount of Rs.77.27 cr. (\in 10 mn) towards principal outstanding to KfW.

Matter is placed before the Group for information.

C. Extension of Consultancy Services under Accompanying Measure:

KfW has approved and appointed consultancy firm M/s. Lahmeyer GkW Consult, Germany towards Technical Assistance (TA) for appraisal of Detailed Project Reports (DPRs), capacity development of NCRPB and its stakeholders on 20.12.2013 under the contract signed between National Capital Region Planning Board, represented by KfW and GKW Consult GmbH (previously M/s.Lahmeyer GKW Consult GmbH). The Total value of the contract is Euro: 999,712/- only. The initial contract was supposed to end on 20.01.2016.

However, considering the pace of implementation of the projects under KfW line of credit and subsequent extension in loan disbursement period i.e., up to December 2018, KfW has agreed to continue funding the consultancy contract with an agreement that NCRPB would fund the service tax, Public charges and Withholding tax liability arising on account of consultancy services to the Indian Tax Department (Article 2.4; taxes (Addendum 2)). In this context, KfW has signed a fresh financing agreement for Euro:800,000/- to fund the services of the experts under the consultancy contract.

Recently NCRPB has signed the Addendum no. 4 on 30.5.2018 for an extension of the consultancy services up to the period ending on 31.01.2019.

NCRPB is funding only the tax liability arising out of the consultancy contract. NCRPB has paid approx. INR: 0.99 Cr. on account of tax payment till 30.11.2017 and the likely expenditure to be incurred by NCRPB for the extended duration is approximately INR:0.80 Cr. only.

Agenda Item No. 4: New Projects submitted to NCRPB with Loan Requests

NCRPB is in receipt of request for sanction of loan for a Water Supply project from CMA Gwalior. Further, a request for additional work from GNIDA with respect to the ongoing STP projects i.e. 15 MLD and 20 MLD has been received. Detailed agendas are as presented below:-

Agenda Item No. 4.1: Development of Water Supply Scheme for Gwalior City

Introduction

The Board has received request for sanction of financial assistance for 'Development of Water Supply Scheme for Gwalior'. The proposed scheme is designed for lifting water from the Chambal River and bringing it to the Tighra Dam.

The existing water supply infrastructure for Gwalior town is inadequate to provide the required service level for Water Supply. The shortfall in existing water supply necessitates the upgradation of the water supply scheme.

Total Cost of the project is Rs. 398.45 cr. The time of completion of the project is between 30-36 months. The project is expected to get start after Oct. 2018 and is expected to be completed by Oct. 2021.

Background

The water demand for the city is estimated as 466 MLD for the year 2051. Gwalior Municipal Corporation (GMC) has proposed sewage treatment plant within the city limit and it is expected that the non-domestic demand of 40 MLD (approx.) can be fed from the recycled water. This will reduce the water demand by 8 % (approx.) and the net water demand will be 426.00 MLD. It is expected that the additional storage of 150 MLD will be arranged by Water Resource Department from the existing sources in addition to the water supply of 130 MLD from Tighra Dam and Upper Kaketo and the city will get 280.00 MLD water from these sources. Therefore, the proposed scheme is designed for the balance water demand of 150.00 MLD.

Govt. of Madhya Pradesh vide its notification dated 19.02.1992 had declared SADA area as CMA to NCR. Therefore, the proposed project coverage area was not under the area of CMA of NCR.

Subsequently, Govt. of Madhya Pradesh has issued a revised notification dated 03.04.2018 vide which the area of CMA was revised and increased (Gwalior Planning Area was added in the CMA). Eventually, the project area comes/falls under the funding scope of the NCRPB.

Need of the Project

The Gwalior's city water demand is presently mainly dependent on the primary source Tighra reservoir on the Sankh river situated about 20 km south west of the city. For about last decade or so the reservoir fails to get sufficient water to get filled to its fullest capacity due to two main reasons:



- Due to dwindling rainfall arising out of changing climate conditions of the region and
- Due to construction of several minor irrigation schemes in the catchment of the reservoir.

Due to decrease in the average rainfall, the reservoir level could only be filled up to about 25 % of its full live storage capacity. This resulted in scarcity of drinking water supply in Gwalior City.

The water Resource Department prepared and submitted an emergency plan to lift dead storage water by pumping from Kaketo & from Paishari dam and transmit it to Tighara dam through its existing canal system and natural streams with an estimated cost of Rs. 15.45 cr to State Government. As there is no alternative source available, this proposal was approved by State Government and being successfully implemented. The water from these sources transported to Tighra dam which accounts as higher losses due to leakage, seepage percolation and evaporation etc.

The projected water demand in the year 2036 and year 2051 are 364 MLD & 466 MLD respectively. Present source of water supply i.e. Tighra reservoir is not sufficient to feed the futuristic demand of the city, hence it is necessary to augment the water supply scheme for the city from the reliable surface water source in the nearby vicinity as Tighra reservoir is exhausting day by day.

In this context the project proposal under consideration for financial assistance has been formulated with an aim/objective to meet the scarcity of water in the Gwalior city.

Project Details:

The raw water will be pumped from the Chambal river and discharged to the stream near Tighra WTP. The length of the transmission main (pumping main) is 65 Kms. The transmission main will run along the NH 03 up to Bamore and from Bamore to Tighra via Mangupura along the road (State Highway/Village Roads). The network is proposed along the National Highway and the village roads.

The transmission main proposed is 1500 mm MS Pipe. The Plate thickness proposed is 14 mm and 12 mm thick. The pumping system is proposed with 3 vertical turbine pumps having static head of 145 mtr. The interconnection provision is made near Moti Jheel to interconnect with the existing gravity main from Tighra Dam.

The approach bridge is proposed considering vehicular access from the existing National Highway (old bridge) to the pump floor level. The pump floor level is 146.02 mtr and the road level is 115.00 mtr. The bridge is proposed to connect these two levels. The width of the approach bridge is considered as 9.00 mtr. The vehicular access with width 4.5 mtr. is considered along with the space width of 2.50 mtr. for pipeline network to Gwalior & 2.00 mtr. width for pipeline network to Morena.

Automation & SCADA

The components are velocity measurement, pressure gauges, liquid level detectors, voltage meters, energy consumptions, control valves and actuators etc. A separate SCADA system is proposed which can be integrated with the existing system at later stage.

Proposed Alignment

The Raw water transmission main is proposed from Chambal river to Tighra Dam. The alignment is proposed along the Mumbai-Agra National Highway (NH-03). It is proposed to lay the line on the right bank of the NH within the ROW.

- i. **Head Work** Consisting of intake Structure, Jackwell and Pump House is proposed between old and new National Highway area. The approach bridge is proposed from the old highway (near temple).
- ii. **Raw water transmission main** The Raw water transmission main is proposed on the left bank along the old National Highway till the junction point (interconnection between old and new Highway). The pipeline is proposed within the right of way of the national highway.

The transmission main is proposed along the right bank of the National Highway. Wherever service road is available, the pipe is proposed in service road. The junctions are treated with concrete encasing. The pipe line will be laid minimum 1.5 mtr below the finished ground level in order to have proper cushioning.

- iii. Highway Crossing The highway crossing is proposed at the interconnection point. The road crossing is proposed with trenchless technology in order to avoid the traffic conjunction. The encasing pipe is 2200 mm MS pipe with concrete bed. The inspection chambers are proposed on the either bank from future maintenance and repair aspect.
- iv. Canal and River Crossing The river crossings are proposed near Chakarauda (Morena), Dompura, Noorabad and canal crossing is proposed near Jarah. These rivers are non-perennial. It is proposed to cross the river from the river bed level. The depth of the pipeline needs to be increased for preventive measures. The additional preventive measures are taken with concrete casing. The concrete bed is proposed in M-25 grade with minimum reinforcement.

The canal needs to be crossed at Jarah. The permission for canal crossing need to be obtained from the concern department (WRE,MP). The level of crossing is to be decided in consultation with the concern department. The canal crossing is



proposed with trenchless technology and minimum 5 mtr. below the canal bed level.

v. **Railway Line Crossing-** The Railway crossing is proposed near Bamore (Narrow Gauge Line). The pipe is proposed to be laid below 3 mtr. depth. Trenchless pipe work is proposed within the entire patch of the land with railway.

Introduction

The Board has received request from Greater Noida Industrial Development Authority (Implementing Agency) seeking financial assistance for extra work to augment the ongoing STP projects i.e. Construction of 15 MLD Sewage Treatment Plant and pumping station at Ecotech – II and Construction of 20 MLD Sewage Treatment Plant and pumping station at Ecotech – III, Greater Noida.

Background

The said projects were earlier approved for financing by PSMG-I in its 50th meeting held on 07.08.2013 under KfW line of credit.

Need of the Project

GNIDA has proposed the said proposal in accordance with the orders of National Green Tribunal (NGT) regarding usage of recycled treated water of STP.

The proposed variation is an integral part of STP to meet new standard that have been devised, which are comparable to global standard with modern technology which will ensure Zero-Bacteria discharge and ensure that human being does not get affected during horticulture. - Requisite Social & Environmental Reports, as applicable.
- Any cost increase over and above the current estimates shall be borne by the agency and all efforts to complete the projects be ensured accordingly.
- All efforts shall be made to complete the work by the stipulated date of completion 03.11.2018



Agenda Item No. 5: Review of Projects financed by the NCR Planning Board

As on date, the Board has provided financial assistance to **351** infrastructure development projects with an estimated cost of Rs. **30348** Crore, out of which an amount of Rs. **14318** Crore has been sanctioned as loan. The Board has released a loan amount of about Rs. **10519** Crore till March 2018. The sub-region wise break up including completed and ongoing projects is as below in Table 1.




- 2 of the ongoing projects have been reported as completed and Completion Certificates received (List at **Appendix-II**).
- Another **8** have reported completed but are yet to submit the necessary Completion Certificates or related clarifications (List at **Appendix-III**).

Point for Decision

- Agencies need to adhere the project completion schedules. The Board should be kept apprised with regard to the delays and the reasons thereof and necessary action that is being taken to avoid further delays.
- Agencies who foresee delays in project completion need to make the necessary extension request with appropriate justification in a timely manner.
- All projects that have been reported completed and completion certificates received since last PSMG may be shifted to List of Completed projects.
- The respective agencies need to expedite submission of the completion certificates and related clarifications for the projects that have been reported completed but having pending submission of completion certificates. They may ensure that the assets proposed under the project have been actually created and are functional on ground as envisaged.



Agenda Item No. 6: Creation of Regional Land use for the newly added district of Shamli in NCR

- a. Subsequent to approval by PSMG-I in its 54th meeting (27.01.2017) to carry out the study through NRSC, Govt. of India, an MOU (amended after addition of three more districts in NCR in November, 2015) was executed between NCRPB and NRSC on May, 2017. The said MoU was valid till May 2018.
- b. The Existing Land use for all the six newly added districts, has been finalised by NRSC in consultation with concerned NCR participating States. The finalized Existing Land Use maps along with GIS database, have been provided to the concerned NCR State Govts. for their reference.
- c. NRSC is now in the process of making other thematic maps related to various sectors/ chapters of the Regional Plan. Once these thematic maps are prepared the work related to preparation of draft Proposed Land Use is to be undertaken.
- d. Further, district Shamli of U.P. has been included in the NCR vide Notification dated 16.04.2018. NCRPB has requested NRSC to extend the scope of work of the MoU signed on May 2017 in order to include Shamli district in the ongoing Study and provide the revised/additional cost estimates and time schedule for the same.

Action Point:

(i) Matter is placed before the Group for granting time extension, till March 2019.

(ii) In-principle approval for undertaking the study for Shamli district, by extending the scope of work of the MoU signed in May 2017, as per the cost estimates provided by NRSC, may be accorded.
